

## Bylaws of FAOA

- 1 Dues and Membership Fees
  - a. There are no Dues or Membership fees for Clubs or Individuals.
- 2 State Tournament Fees and Registration
  - a. FAOA shall receive \$5 per Archer, Excepting dependent family members, from the host club.
  - b. Additional Tournament Fees may be charged to pay off any outstanding debt owed by FAOA, or to fund planned equipment replacement. These fees, not to exceed \$5 per archer, must be approved by the membership at a General Meeting.
- 3 FAOA Equipment
  - a. Any club or person hosting a FAOA sponsored tournament has free use of any target mats, stands and/or signal lighting equipment owned by FAOA. Hosting party is responsible for picking up and returning equipment from approved storage location.
  - b. Any Club or person hosting an Ohio State JOAD Championship Tournament has free use of any target mats, stands and/or signal lighting equipment owned by FAOA. Hosting party is responsible for picking up and returning equipment from approved storage location.
  - c. Any club or person wishing to rent FAOA equipment for any other tournament may do so upon approval of the President. Rental fees shall be as follows: \$5 for each set of target mat/stand per day of shooting, including practice days, \$5 for signal lights per day of shooting. Renting party is responsible for picking up and returning equipment for approved storage location.
- 4 FAOA Tournaments
  - a. There shall be four FAOA tournaments each year: State Indoor Championship, State Field Championship, Double 900, and State Outdoor Championship, State JOAD Indoor Championship, State JOAD Outdoor Championship.
  - b. Bids for tournaments are due at the Outdoor Championship for the following year.
  - c. All tournaments shall be registered with the NAA, and must be registered as STAR tournaments except the Double 900
- 5 Annual Awards
  - a. The male recurve bow shooter with the highest accumulated score for the State Indoor Championship, State Field Championship, Double 900, and State Outdoor Championship shall be named the Men's All Events Champion. The Champion will receive the All Events Trophy until the Following year.
  - b. The female recurve bow shooter with the highest accumulated score for the State Indoor Championship, State Field Championship, Double 900, and State Outdoor Championship shall be named the Women's All Events Champion. The Champion will receive the All Events Trophy until the Following year.
  - c. The male Compound bow shooter with the highest accumulated score for the State Indoor Championship, State Field Championship, Double 900, and State Outdoor Championship shall be named the Men's Compound

All Events Champion. The Champion will receive the All Events Trophy until the Following year.

- d. The female Compound bow shooter with the highest accumulated score for the State Indoor Championship, State Field Championship, Double 900, and State Outdoor Championship shall be named the Women's Compound All Events Champion. The Champion will receive the All Events Trophy until the Following year.
- e. The Divisions competing for this trophy are as Follows: All Master Divisions, Senior, and Jr. Divisions are eligible for the trophy. The people who shoot ALL 4 tournaments with the highest score will be the winner.
